	She also reported that this year, while there were a few jurisdictions that had questions those questions were addressed and there were no jurisdictions which submitted businesses to be reviewed for possible adjustment.	
	Valerie reported that in August, DOR will send out a message letting all local jurisdictions know there is no change and with that will complete the 2013 annual review process.	
Discuss 2014 Annual Review	The 2014 review schedule for 2015 payments was reviewed. There were no concerns raised.	
	In August 2013, the data for review by local jurisdictions will be sent out. Any businesses which jurisdictions feel need adjusted should be sent to the Department by April 30, 2014.	
Market Place Fairness Act	Tim Jennrich explained the effects of the Marketplace Fairness Act (MFA) of 2013 should it be enacted. He stated under MFA, remote sellers are not required to register through the Streamlined Sales and Use Tax Agreement (SSUTA). MFA remote sellers can register directly with the Department or through SSUTA's central registration system. For those that register throug SSUTA's central registration system, the reported revenues would offset the gain/loss of SST mitigation. However, those that register through the Department's registration process would not unless there was a legislative change. This would also require the Department to modify the Department' registration system to recognize MFA remote sellers' registrations.	
	Doug Levy was under the assumption mitigation was going to be a ramp down and end. He expressed the need for a reliable estimate at the jurisdiction level of the impacts of the MFA. He asked how we as a committee can work with the Department to make that happen. A separate group will get together to agree on a methodology and how to best make this estimate available. Don Gutmann and Patti Wilson will work with Doug Levy on setting up a meeting for this group.	
Next Annual Meeting	Don Gutmann asked for comments on how the committee liked or disliked the teleconference versus traveling to Olympia for the meeting. Participants agreed the teleconference was more productive, especially for a 25-30 minute meeting. However, if MFA occurs before the next annual Mitigation Meeting the committee would like to meet face-to-face.	
	We are aiming to hold the next annual Mitigation Meeting via teleconference in late June or early July 2014.
